

6th U.S. WOMEN'S AMATEUR FOUR-BALL CHAMPIONSHIP

Quail Creek Country Club (QCCC) has been selected by the United States Golf Association (USGA) as the host site for the 6th U.S. Women's Amateur Four-Ball Championship. This is the **1st USGA CHAMPIONSHIP IN COLLIER COUNTY.**

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

Two years ago, the USGA selected Quail Creek Country Club to host the 31st U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur Championship. Unfortunately, due to Hurricane Irma, the Club had to cancel the event. USGA Championship Director, Rachel Sadowski said, "Since relocating the U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur, returning to QCCC has been a priority for the USGA. We're looking forward to continuing our relationship with the club, as well as the vibrant golf community in Naples, and know they will be a terrific host."

The USGA conducts the competition and will have over 50 USGA Officials and Staff here during the Championship. Ed Dyer and Bill Flowers will Co-Chair the QCCC Host Committee consisting of 11 Sub-Committees.

Championship consists of 64 teams (sides)

April 23 – 24	Practice rounds
April 25 – 26	Stroke Play qualifying
April 27	Match Play: 32 teams (sides)
April 28	Match Play: Morning – 16 teams (sides); Afternoon – 8 teams (sides)
April 29	Semi-Final: Morning – 4 teams (sides); Championship: Afternoon – 2 teams (sides)



WHO IS PLAYING?

Two-player teams (sides) will compete in 18 hole sectional qualifying across the United States from August 2019 to March 2020 with 64 teams (sides) reaching the Championship.

Last year there were over 300 teams (sides) that went through the process of qualifying to participate in the Championship. The field was made up of players from 30 States and 10 countries, including nine past USGA Champions.

WHAT IS A FOUR-BALL?

Stroke Play Competition: Each team member will play their own ball. The team's score on each hole is the lower of the two players scores. The winners are the team with the lowest aggregate score after 36 holes.

Match Play Competition: The top 32 teams from Stroke Play will qualify for the Match Play. Teams will be seeded according to their finish in the Stroke Play competition. Two teams of two players competing directly against each other. All four golfers play their own balls throughout the round. Each hole is won by the team whose member has the lowest score.

HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE?

The success of past and future championships lies in the strength and commitment of our volunteer teams. There are many volunteer opportunities: registration, marshals, scoring, caddies, etc. We look forward to having you join us in making the first USGA championship in Collier County a successful event for the nation's best women amateur golfers.
